# County Road Projects

(1) Route 611 (Tyler Road)- (Graham)- Advertised later this year with construction beginning in the spring

## Open Space Eco-Park

(Zumpino) - Resolution 10-102-2022 on current agenda amends Shared Services Agreement with County. Future design services will be paid for by the County. (Graham) County will be entering into a contract directly with Melillo and Bauer for additional design services regarding Eco-Park and Jake's Law Playground. (Zumpino)-DCA gave informal approval toward using Small Cities Grant money toward Jake's Law playground equipment purchase. County will be installing the equipment at their cost. Discussion regarding funding, meeting with Open Space, and phase closeouts.

### Mobile Carrier Projects at Water Tower

(1) AT&T Generator- (Graham) scheduling onsite meetings with VCom and AT&T regarding generator placement and orientation concerns. SJ Gas application received for gas main installation on Adams Ave to service generator and any future generators, need additional information regarding placement of gas service. (2) Dish Network

### **USDA** Projects

- (1) Water Project
- (a) Contract #1 (Generator)- (Verna) Nearing completion for what is currently under contract and change orders. Waiting on parts to finish installations. Substantial completion in November with closeout by end of year unless additional funding is secured for further work.
- (2) Asset Management Plan- Waiting for state
- (3) Sewer Project- (Graham) Progress meeting scheduled with County and separate meeting with DEP scheduled to discuss funding. (Zumpino & Noon)) Discussion regarding quarterly reports and outlay reports. (Verna) Requested permission to send CAD file on project to Woodbine Development Center. Permission granted.
- (4) Hat Factory Property (ECWAG) (Graham) Waiting on approval of application from USDA for additional funds to continue project. Resolutions on current agenda for amendments to engineering contracts. (Noon) Waiting on financial information from CFO Jim Craft to complete application for additional funding.

# Adams Avenue/Franklin Street Project-

(Verna) Bids received, but all were above funding. Necessary to create a reduced scope contract, seek DOT approval that the contract falls within parameters of grant funding, and amend the contract documents. A new bid process will then be scheduled. Resolutions on agenda to request a second time extension from DOT and to reject bids that were previously received.

DeHirsch Avenue Project-

(Verna) waiting for DOT Local Aid to schedule a site meeting regarding rideability of the roadway.

Clay Street/Madison Avenue Project-

(Graham) Waiting on DCA to award professional contracts. (Zumpino) Documents sent to DCA for approval

DOT Sumner Avenue Bikeway-

(Verna) Final revisions to state specifications and updating plans. Sending it to Bruce Graham for approval then to DOT. Project on schedule

DOT Pavement Preservation Pilot Program-

(Graham) Waiting on DOT review.

Landfill Redevelopment Zone – Solar Project (Graham) Pending Pinelands approval for landfill closure. Speaking with vendors regarding cap on landfill. BPU denial of extension of time for Solar Community designation still being addressed by mayor. (Zumpino) setting meeting with ACUA and legislative officials to speak about reinstatement or redesignation as a Solar Community in next round of designation so that community is able to take advantage of lower utility rates.

NJDEP Assignment of Municipal Stormwater from Tier B to Tier A- Resolution on agenda to protest change. (Tonetta) Still has not received documents requested from Mr. Mahone. Will follow up with a status request. (Graham) Issue is gaining traction across the state as the realization of the added expense of the change of determination creates is being understood.

Cannabis Escrow- No change

Lead Based Paint Policy Program- No change.

Railroad Trestle Bridge- Working along with DOT to create a scope of work to improve the trestle bridge and inspection of girders. (Zumpino) Working to combine improving the bridge and a streetscape project.

Escrow Account Activity- All parties given escrow account balances and activity.

Correction of Errors in Ordinance 597-2021 and Correction of Errors in Ordinance 606-2022 By Municipal Attorney Per N.J.S.A. 40:49-4 "The work of revision and codification shall be done under the direction of the municipal counsel or attorney ...."

(Tonetta) Correction letter will be submitted day following meeting.

Water Installment Plan for Unpaid Charges: State law requires the Borough to offer residential customers an installment plan for unpaid water charges. Also, the DCA Low Income Household Water Assistance Program is taking applications from eligible households. Additional information is posted on the website or contact the Tax Collector.
